

Child Care Licensing Transfer Update

As you are aware, the Child Care Licensing Team officially transitioned out of the Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF) and into the Department of Human Services (DHS) on **October 28**, **2019.** This change is another effort to strengthen child care services for Rhode Islanders and better support the workforce.

Key leadership within the Child Care Licensing Team will remain with the team during this transfer. Nicole Chiello will remain with the team and assume the role of Administrator of Child Care Licensing & Regulation at DHS.
