Rhode Island Weatherization Assistance Program



What is Weatherization?

The Weatherization Assistance Program is intended to help income-eligible households reduce heating bills by providing whole house energy efficiency services to households that qualify for the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP).

To be eligible for LIHEAP, a household must be at or below 60% of the State's median income levels that are set each year. See the chart below or visit dhs.ri.gov/LIHEAP-FFY26-income-guidelines for the FFY2026 income guidelines.

Health and Safety Measures

- Perform heating system safety testing.
- Perform combustion appliance safety testing.
- Inspect vent systems.
- Install mechanical ventilation to ensure adequate indoor air quality.
- Install smoke and carbon monoxide alarms.
- Evaluate mold or moisture hazards.
- Perform incidental safety repairs if necessary.



Client Education Activities

- Educate on potential household hazards such as carbon monoxide, mold & moisture, indoor air pollutants, lead paint, and radon.
- Instruction on how to use any newly installed equipment.
- Discuss the benefits of using energy-efficient products.

Mechanical Measures

- Clean, tune, repair, or replace heating systems when needed.
- Seal leaks in heating ducts.
- Repair or replace water heaters if necessary.
- Insulate water heating pipes.
- Fix improper dryer venting.



Emergency Measures

- Repairs to your heating system.
- Emergency heating system replacements.

Building Shell Measures

- Install insulation where needed.
- Perform blower door directed air sealing.
