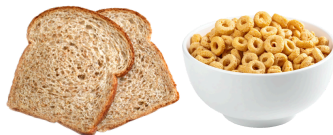
Are There Changes to What I Can Buy with SNAP?

There are no changes in Rhode Island to what you can or cannot buy with SNAP. You may have heard other states have a SNAP purchases restriction waiver, but Rhode Island does not.

The updated dietary guidelines for Americans and new food pyramid also do not affect what you can or cannot buy with SNAP.

What I Can Buy with SNAP

Breads and cereals



Eggs, seafood, poultry, and steak



Dairy products

This includes nonfat, low-fat and full-fat.



Seeds and plants that grow food to eat



Fruits and vegetables

This includes fresh, frozen and canned.



Soft drinks, candy, cookies, snack crackers, ice cream, and bakery cakes

You can buy birthday or special occasion cakes with SNAP if the non-edible decorations cost less than half of the total price of the item (most of these cakes are OK).

What I Cannot Buy with SNAP

- Beer, wine, liquor, cigarettes or tobacco
- Hot foods or foods that will be eaten in the store
- Any non-food items, such as:
 - pet foods
 - soaps and paper products
 - household supplies
- Vitamins and medicines
- Live animals
- Items that have a Supplement Facts label

Did You Know?



You can double your SNAP at the farmers' market! For every \$1 you spend through your SNAP benefits, you get an extra \$1 in Bonus Bucks to spend there.

An example of how to spend SNAP and get extra to spend:

- 1 Bring your EBT (SNAP) card to the farmers' market welcome table. Swipe for the amount to spend. Let's say you want to spend \$3 of your SNAP benefits.
- 2 \$3 from your SNAP benefits gives you \$3 in Fresh Bucks tokens to use at vendors.
- 3 You also get \$3 in Bonus Bucks to spend on fresh fruits, vegetables, and herbs from local farms.
