In accordance to Rhode Island General Laws (RIGL) 42-35, notice is hereby given that the Department of Human services proposes the following DHS State Plan:

### **2022 R.I. Weatherization Assistance Program**

The Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP) Grant is funded through the United States Department of Energy. The purpose of the Weatherization Assistance Program is to assist Rhode Island's income eligible households meet the cost burden of home energy by improving the energy efficiency of income eligible homes. Rhode Island's WAP is administered by the Department of Human Services. WAP intake and outreach is provided by local Community Action Agencies (CAP).

A public hearing will be held to consider the proposed plan on Monday, May 2, 2022, from 10:00AM to 12:00 Noon at the RI Department of Human Services Louis Pasteur Building, 25 Howard Ave. 1<sup>st</sup> Floor, Cranston, RI 02920 in the West Wing Conference Room. The Hearing will begin at 10:00 AM and will conclude when the last speaker finishes testimony or at 12:00 Noon, whichever comes first. The RI Department of Human Services, Louis Pasteur Building is accessible to the handicapped.
