2026 Rhode Island Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program

The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) Block Grant is funded through the United States Department of Health and Human Services. The purpose of LIHEAP is to assist Rhode Island's income eligible households meet the increasing cost of home energy and reduce the severity of a home energy related crisis. Funds are also used to improve the energy efficiency of income eligible homes. Rhode Island's LIHEAP is administered by the RI Department of Human Services. The daily work of LIHEAP such as intake, outreach, and payments are handled by local Community Action Agencies (CAAs).
