

# Attending College in Rhode Island?

## Don't Choose Between Textbooks & Food

College students who meet SNAP income and residency requirements may be eligible to receive SNAP benefits if one of the following are true for you:

- Enrolled at least half time in Post Secondary Education
- Employed or self-employed an average of 20 hours a week
- Participating in a work study program (rules apply)
- Caring for a dependent household member (rules apply)
- Are a single parent and full-time student responsible for the care of a dependent child under 12
- Assigned or placed in a higher education institution through Work Force Investment Act, Employment & Training Program, or Trade Act Program
- Have a physical or mental condition that limits your ability to Work
- Receiving RIW/PSE assistance
- Participating in an on-the-job training program
- Are age 17 or younger, or 50 or older
